Types of Memberships

Full/Family Membership Allows the member, his/her partner and any children under the age of 18 on 1 January of the current year (or over 18 and in full time education) to

- Make full use of the Club and all its facilities ashore and on the water.
- Take part fully in Club racing.
- Use Club boats and take part in training activities organised by the Club.
- Leave their boats at the Club (subject to availability and on payment of berthing fees)

Full/Family members have voting rights at general meetings of the Club (one vote for each membership)

Junior Membership Open to those under the age of 18 on 1 January of the current year. Gives similar rights to those of full members except that individual Junior members pay a reduced berthing fee. Junior members do not have a vote at meetings of the Club.

Student Membership Open to those over eighteen who are still in full time education, e.g. in school, university, college or similar situation. Gives the same rights as Junior Membership.

Crewing Membership Allows the member use of the Club facilities ashore together with more limited rights to crew in members' boats in races and to helm or crew in members' boats in general sailing. Crewing members cannot use or leave their own boats at the Club. They do not have voting rights or access to Club boats.

Social Membership Gives the member the use of Club facilities ashore but only very limited access to the water as if they were the guests of members with sailing rights. Social members cannot use or leave their own boats at the Club. They do not have voting rights or access to Club boats.

Entrance Fee A one-off entrance fee is payable by all new full/family members or junior members when they first join the Club. The entrance fee for full/family members may however be paid in two instalments over the first two years.

Member's Responsibilities

Safety First All members must wear buoyancy aids when on the water or on the jetties.

Sailing Duties The yearly sailing programme of both racing and social sailing depends entirely upon members fulfilling their allocated duties, so that it can continue safely, for the enjoyment of all. Each full member is allocated two or three duties throughout the course of the year. These are detailed in the handbook, which is produced and distributed at the beginning of the season. The duties include Officer of the Day (OD), Assistant Officer of the Day (AOD) and Rescue Boat Crew.

The OD should contact the AOD and Rescue Crew in good time before the duty day to ensure that they have not forgotten. If any of the team is not available to carry out their duty, it is their own responsibility to find a replacement. The Assistant Sailing Secretary needs to be informed of any changes made to the duty schedule. Please make sure you arrive at least an hour before the first race, when on duty. Detailed instructions, for organising the racing and using the safety boats, are available in the OD file, located in the brown hut and in the handbook. If you are not familiar with the duty you have been allocated then get in touch and ask for help.

Working Parties All members have an obligation to participate in at least two working parties during the year. The purpose of these is to keep the club facilities in a fit state to enable us all to enjoy our sailing. The jobs undertaken on these days are many and various, so there is something for everyone to do!

Boat Insurance All member's boats, berthed or sailed at the club, must have current Third Party risks insurance, for a minimum of £2,000,000.

Members joining from 1 August pay half the subscription and berthing fees for the remainder of the year to 31 December. Entrance fees are not reduced.

Members joining from 1 October pay the current subscription and berthing fee rates plus 10% to cover the remainder of the current year and the next full year.
